Write a Letter to the Bishop Asking for the Sacrament of Confirmation

Letters to the Bishop should be typed and hand signed. Use the same care that you would for a business letter or job application cover letter. The length should be close to one page. Use nice stationary if you have it.

Heading: Address your letter to "Dear Bishop","

Introduction: Introduce yourself. Describe who you are, your name, some personal information, what your interests and hopes for the future are.

Body:

- 1. Indicate why you are writing (to ask for the Sacrament)
- 2. Describe what you have done to prepare for Confirmation, and what part of the preparation had the most meaning for you.
- 3. Prayers or ways of praying that are especially meaningful to you.
- 4. Share information regarding parents or sponsors or others who have influenced your decision to be confirmed.
- 5. Your sponsor and why you chose them.
- 6. Importance of your chosen Confirmation name/saint.
- 7. Faith in Action activities that helped you to understand 'service to others.'
- 8. How will receiving the Holy Spirit in Confirmation make a difference in your life? Why your Catholic faith is important to you.
- 9. What difference will you make in the Church?
- 10. Summarize your desire to be Confirmed. Point to a definite reason that you want Confirmation. Make a formal request for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Closing:

Thank the Bishop; express your interest in meeting him. You may also express concern for an issue/ask for prayer for that issue/person.

Close with... "Sincerely" or another appropriate closing, and sign your name.
